Location and Description

Brockport Central School District is one of the oldest centralized districts in the state, covering over 72 square miles bordering the shore of Lake Ontario. Located on the banks of the historic Erie Canal, Brockport is 20 miles west of the city of Rochester. The District serves approximately 3,085 students in grades Pre K-12, with three elementary schools, one middle school and one high school.

Students from a variety of ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds attend District schools. The District's population includes approximately 3% African American (non-Hispanic); 1% Asian; 11% Hispanic/Latino; 79% White (non-Hispanic), and 6% Multi-Racial.

Brockport High School Summary

Brockport High School is a large comprehensive public school serving grades 9-12. Brockport offers a full range of college preparatory and career and technical courses, as well as a number of special programs of study:

 $\sqrt{3-1-3}$ Program - a senior year program for academically motivated students through which students meet senior year graduation requirements while completing the first year of a baccalaureate degree at SUNY Brockport.

✓ Engineering Technology- an honors level preengineering program designed for students interested in pursuing a degree in engineering.

- New Visions an interdisciplinary immersion program that offers high school and college credits, professional internships, real-world knowledge and a community service component.
- WEMOCO an off-site career and technical education center that offers students hands-on training in more than 20 Middle Skill programs.

Brockport currently offers 9 honors courses, 18 Advanced Placement courses, and career internship opportunities. We also offer dual credit courses through which students can earn high school and college credit from Monroe Community College (MCC), Genesee Community College (GCC) and Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT).

Beyond the classroom, Brockport students participate in over 45 clubs and 24 interscholastic athletic programs, with many students participating in multiple activities. Brockport has developed a unique transition program - Focus, Learn, Engage, Connect (F.L.E.C.) - that allows many upper classmen to develop leadership skills by mentoring incoming freshman, teaching mini-lessons, tutoring, and connecting freshman to extracurricular activities.

InstructionalMethods: Brockport High School provided in-person learning in 2021-2022.

Testing: Students who earned a passing grade in their US History class earned an "E" on their transcript for the regents exam grade.

Students were also awarded a special appeal (SA) on their transcript if they passed a course that ended in a regents exam and scored between a 50-64 on the exam.

We aspire to be a leading, innovative, high-performing school district that graduates each student prepared for college or a career.

In 2022, 92% of our Brockport High School senior class earned a New York State Diploma and 61.5% planned to participate in post-secondary education.

43.0% of the graduates from the Class of 2022 went on to attend a 4 year college or university, 18.5% are attending 2 year colleges, and 1.5% enlisted in the military. Much of the remaining 37.0% pursued vocational apprenticeships/trade school or employment.

Curriculum information

Art

A comprehensive art curriculum that includes Studio Art, Drawing and Painting I & II, Ceramics I & II, Jewelry & Metals, Photography I & II, Sculpture, Computer Art, Media Arts, AP Studio Art & 2-D Design and AP Studio Art 3-D Design.

Business

Business and Career and Technical offerings include Accounting*, Entrepreneurism*, MS Office w/Essential Computing Skills*, Keyboarding and Essential Computing Skills*, Career and Financial Management, Personal Financial Planning*, Math and Finance, Sports Entertainment Marketing, Introduction to Business*, Business and Personal Law, College Preparation 11 & 12, Introduction to Marketing, as well as a Career Internship Program. The Business Department offers three pathways for students to obtain an CTE Endorsement which indicates completion of sequential and rigorous series of courses passed along with a national industry assessment. https://cte.nyc/web/faq/ what-cte-endorsed-diploma

English

Regents level offerings exist for all required English courses, including English 1, English 1 Honors, English 2, English 3 and English 4. In addition, the English Department offers Pre-AP English 2, Honors English 4, AP English Language & Composition and AP English Literature & Composition and Creative Writing.

Health

Personal Wellness, Professional Rescuer and Life & Death are offered, in addition to the health course required for graduation.

World Languages

Five levels are offered in French and Spanish; including an Honors level French 5 & Spanish 5. *Starting in 2019 BHS awarded the Seal of Biliteracy to students who can demonstrate mastery of two languages (one of which is English) through the completion of a variety of checkpoints within three pathways. http://www.nysed.gov/ world-languages/new-york-state-seal-biliteracynyssb*

Math

Students complete graduation requirements utilizing Regents Common Core Algebra, Geometry, and Algebra 2. Other courses available include: Algebra 1A, Algebra 1B, Pre-Algebra 2, Math & Finance, Math Connections, College Prep Math, Math in the Trades, Pre-Calculus and AP Calculus AB/BC. Honors level math is offered for Pre-Calculus.

Music

Music offerings include Band, Orchestra, Choir, Explorations in Music, Guitar, Piano, Music Theory and AP Music Theory, as well as a number of select music groups including Blue Notes, Jazz Ensemble, Handsome Devils, Triple Voices, Mad Vocals, Percussion Ensemble, and Symphonic Orchestra.

Science

Lab sciences include Regents courses in Earth Science, Living Environment, Chemistry and Physics. Honors level is offered for Chemistry. Other science courses may include: Conceptual Chemistry, Conceptual Physics, Environmental Science, Horticulture, Forensic Science, Astronomy, Human Anatomy & Physiology, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Physics 1, AP Physics C: Mechanics, and AP Environmental Science.

Social Studies

Regents level offerings exist for all required Social Studies courses, including Global History & Geography 1 and 2, (Humanities levels 1 & 2) US History & Government, Economics, and Government. Honors level courses are offered for Economics and Government. AP level courses are offered for World History 1 & 2, US History, Microeconomics, US Government & Politics, European History and Psychology. Additional electives include General Psychology, Sociology, Violence in America, Crime, Punishment & Rights, and Criminal Justice.

Starting in 2021-22, BHS was approved by NYS as a pilot school, able to award the Seal of Civic Readiness. The Seal of Civic Readiness is awarded to students who make a positive difference in the public life of our community through the combination of civic knowledge, skills and actions, mindsets, and experiences. http:// www.nysed.gov/curriculum-instruction/civicreadiness-initiative

Technology

Courses include Design Drawing for Production (DDP), Design & Drawing for Production Engineering Technology*, Broadcast Media Production, Production Systems, Transportation Systems, Residential Construction, Electronics, Creativity & Innovations, Intro. to Computer Science-Video Game Design, Robotics & CNC Machining, Civil Engineering & Architecture*, Capstone Engineering Technology*, AP Computer Science A*, and Optics. *The BHS Technology Department offers a pathway for students to obtain a CTE Endorsement which indicates completion of a sequential and rigorous series of technology courses along with a national assessment. http://www.nysed.gov/career-technical-education/ technical-endorsement*
