The Brockport Alternative School Environment (BASE) at Brockport High School opened its doors to approximately 35 students in September 2014. A multidisciplinary committee comprised of teachers, mental health professionals and administrators developed the program last school year. BASE is a voluntary program for high school students who may face challenges attending classes in a larger high school setting or other personal challenges.

BASE aims to provide an alternative learning environment to guide and support students. This support and guidance is offered through coursework presented within a smaller learning community as students work toward accomplishing individual goals and ultimately, graduation. Reduced class size, strong teacher-student relationships, opportunities for credit recovery, and differentiated instruction are hallmarks of the program.

So far, at the halfway point in the school year, many great successes and some opportunities for improvement have been identified. We are excited that nine students earned honor roll or high honor roll distinction for the first marking period. This is quite an accomplishment for all of them, especially since only one of them had earned the same honor last year at this time. As a brand new program, it is a priority for teachers and administrators to continue collaborating and reviewing student data and individual student progress to ensure students receive high-quality alternative learning opportunities in which they will be successful.
