
A salute to Brockport's Best

The 2014-15 school year has ended, but we want to take a moment to congratulate all the year's winners of Brockport's Best Awards, especially our latest honorees.

April saw the Brockport's Best recognition go to several outstanding staff members and two departments.

Charlie Clark, aka "Mr. Charlie" drives Bus #199. Nominated by the Bruno family, Mr. Charlie is credited with putting the hustle in the Bruno kids when they get ready for school in the morning. They are disappointed if they have to drive in with dad. Principal Bruno said, "Mr. Charlie has a knack for making the most anxious kindergarteners comfortable, and always has a smile and a story to share with the kids on his bus. We are lucky to have drivers like Charlie Clark."



Bus drivers **Gary Mault** and **Mike Sorce** were recognized for their alertness and responsiveness which averted a potentially dangerous situation. As they drove their separate routes, each spotted a Middle School student walking along Route 19 on a very cold day. The boy was far from home and visibility on the road



was poor. Sorce said, "We're trained to look for anything that's out of the ordinary and this was." Both drivers informed the Transportation Department and, with the combined efforts of other BCSD staff, the boy was returned home safely. They epitomize the fact that every staff person can be depended upon to look out for the safety and security of our children.

Mr. Scott Wilson, Head Custodian at the Ginther & Barclay Schools, does bus duty every morning. He was nominated for a Brockport's Best Award because so many of our parents notice and appreciate that he is always focused on the children and provides them with a heightened sense of security.
