

Food Allergies?

- Be specific about all allergies on the health form, especially food allergies.
- Let your child's chaperone know immediately.

Packing for the Trip

- Dress comfortably and appropriately for the bus ride and for touring.
- REMEMBER clothing must follow the school dress code...sorry NO pajama pants.
- Each student is allowed only **1 suitcase and 1** carry-on bag.
- Label the suitcase and carry-on bag with student's name and bus number.
- Refer to the packing list that will be distributed to students at a future walking group meeting.

Luggage Drop-off




Lunch on Monday

Illness Related Concerns

- Participants exhibiting cold symptoms (common cold, flu, etc.) will be monitored to determine what steps, if any, are to be taken next.
- Typically, the individual remains at the hotel with appropriate supervision and rejoins their group when feeling better.
- If cold symptoms get worse (moderate-to-high grade fever or recurrent vomiting, etc.), a request will be made for parent to pick up their child. Severely ill students cannot be transported on the buses.


In Case of an Emergency

Contingency plans are in place, and all chaperones will be informed regarding the proper procedures to follow if there is an emergency.

PED Use Policy

Chaperones will identify PED use as a "red", "yellow", or "green" time. The phone use designation will change throughout the day.


- "Red" times: walking between sites, emergency situations, etc. Students may not use their PEDs under any circumstances. Students are not to ask permission to use their PED during red times.
- "Yellow" times: touring. Students **need to ask** their chaperone for permission to text/call.
- "Green" times: in hotel room, on bus, during meal breaks.



PED Use Policy continued

- This trip is an **educational** trip.
- Cell phones can be used for calling or texting while touring **ONLY** with chaperone permission.
- Please establish check-in call/text times that will not infringe upon the educational nature of this trip.
- Students using their phones to call/text without chaperone permission will have their phones confiscated. Phones will be returned at administration's discretion.
