I hope this edition of our Focus newsletter finds you and yours enjoying our spring season!

In the following pages, you will see that we have a lot to celebrate! We are very proud of our students who participate in a variety of opportunities both in and outside of their classroom! We are grateful and appreciative of our staff for helping provide our students with these opportunities and for our parents who support us!

In addition to excelling in social emotional learning, our students are making great strides academically. ### INSTRUCTIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

### New resources raise the bar, set high standards for ELA programs

Using feedback from teachers following the pandemic, Brockport Central has created his three-pronged approach aiming to: decrease class sizes, provide teachers with new resources, and offer teachers more support through professional development opportunities.

The Office of Instruction, with the assistance of a cohort of teachers, decided to use federal funding allocated toward learning loss to bring new ELA resources into our schools. This year, Ginther began using Center for Collaborative Classrooms (CCC) for students in kindergarten and first grade, while Barclay, Hill and OMS brought HMH into grade 2-8 classrooms. Both programs are designed to develop students' skills in word recognition,

language comprehension, reading comprehension, writing, critical thinking and technical integration.

The District provided a spring training, a mid-summer training and two superintendent's conference training days for teachers to familiarize themselves with the new resources before the beginning of the 2022-23 school year. In the fall, teachers were provided 30-minute check-ins to answer any questions, as well as two in-person learning walks where instructional coaches from each program audited lessons and provided feedback to our instructors.

"Teacher reception to the programs has been great," said Director of Learning and Staff Development Brandon Broughton. "In order to continually raise the bar, we need to practice how we play and, like with anything else, we are working on building a solid foundation as we prepare to circle back with a second round of training this year. Our team is doing a great job."

One thing that has helped has been hiring additional faculty to reduce class sizes, allowing students to think critically on a more individual level.

The sustainability of these programs has been a highlight for our classrooms. With new workbooks regularly being released every three to five years and updated professional development opportunities being released to accompany the changes, both students and staff are constantly raising the bar.

# eSports take off at Brockport High School

eSports students at BHS teamed up with eSports Advisor Mr. Josh Miller and Network Technician Mr. Brian Harris to help Engineering by Design students during a PC Building Seminar this winter. The computers built during the seminar were used by the team at eSports events this spring.

Brockport High School's eSports team is one of only a few in the area, with 40 students involved and more joining each day. The team competes in different games just as a normal sport would, but the games they compete in are online. Through eSports, students learn teamwork and communication skills to not only help them improve in the games they compete in, but in everyday life.

During competitions, students compete in the BCSD eSports lab and communicate with teammates via voice chat so they have clear communication throughout each game. Brockport students play against other districts across New York State over an eight-week timespan in order to qualify for playoffs.

This spring, the eSports team hopes to improve on what they struggled with during the fall season to place even better than they have in the past. The season began in February, with playoffs scheduled for April.



# BHS students compete in Science Olympiad

On Saturday February 4, ten students from Brockport High School competed in the Regional Science Olympiad tournament with other schools from Monroe County and the surrounding area.



Science Olympiad

consists of over 20 events in Science, Math, Technology, and Engineering. Students prepared the last few months, practicing lab skills, researching college-level science, studying trees and rocks and minerals, designing and building bridges, catapults, and airplanes.

The team, coached by Joe Flanagan and Craig Coon, placed eleventh overall and placed in the top ten in many events. Some of the highlights included:

Those successfully completing the class will receive an MV285 certificate that gives the holder the privilege to receive a Class D operator's license when reaching age 17, allowing them to drive after 9 pm. Students must be 16 years old by July 10, 2023 and hold a valid NYS Driver Permit or License to be eligible for the course. The Pre-Licensing 5-hour Course material is included in Driver Education.

Most insurance companies will offer a discount on compulsory car insurance upon request.

**Classroom Instruction:** Students must attend all 16 sessions of classroom instruction in the high school room 192. The loan of a text is included in the class fee.

Please note: Student must be present for the first theory class to be allowed entry into the course. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of the first class. (Late arrivals will not be admitted and, if registered, will forfeit course enrollment). No early dismissals from theory class are allowed.

New York State mandates that students must attend 16 -(90 minute theory classes) and 16 – (90 minute in-car sessions) Special Note: NYS mandates that all students must attend 16 classroom sessions and 16 driving sessions. This is a commitment. Therefore, if you miss a class or driving session- you may have to wait until the Fall session in the middle of September to make it up, and then you will be able to receive your certificate of completion for the course. 

Scheduling of or transportation to the road test are not included. Parents or other qualified adults should plan to devote time for enrolled students to practice the skills learned in this class. Only experience and good judgment makes a safe driver. A current NYS Learner's Permit must be brought to all classes.




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# Bringing "Friends" together during Class Acts
