# BROCKPORT FOCUSES ON EQUITY WITH FREE MEALS AND SUPPLIES

Brockport Central School District is providing equity for all students with District-provided supplies and free meals for all students for the 2023-24 school year! Our District aims to lessen the burden on our community and create a solution for students and parents that allows for ease and preparedness during the school year.

The District-provided supplies initiative was included in the school budget as a way to give back to the community and create fairness for all families. Eliminating school supply lists also allows for students, parents, and teachers to be sufficient in their readiness for the school year. BCSD is dedicated to our students' learning and creating valuable class time that contributes to their success.

Through the federal Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program, Brockport students also have access to free breakfast and lunch this school year. Since the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year, there has been an increase in the number of students receiving

school breakfast and lunch thanks to this program. Providing students with a nutritious breakfast and lunch is our District's priority as well as creating an environment where all students have the opportunity to thrive. Snacks and additional meals are still available to be purchased.

Offering free meals for students has had a significant impact on Brockport's Food Services with their team working hard to adapt to accommodate the rise in demand for meals. With a 14% increase of all buildings participating in breakfast and a 17% increase for all buildings for lunch, increased hours at buildings have been implemented to respond to and meet these demands. The Food Service department is evaluating staffing needs and working to add staff to buildings while collaborating with other school buildings to ensure all students who want breakfast and lunch are able to receive and have access to meals.

"As a department, we are very excited about the opportunity to provide free breakfast and lunch for all full day students attending Brockport Central School District," says Food Service Director Stacey Snyder. "We have a great team of nutritional professionals to prepare, healthy and nutritious meals every day that will help improve student outcomes, achievements, well-being, and behavior that are all tied to daily nutrition. We are excited to see participation increase as the year continues, along with helping safeguard students from hunger, because you can't learn when you are hungry."



# **Emergency Procedure Review**

The safety and security of students and staff remains a priority at Brockport Central School District. Each year we review our emergency policies and procedures to ensure students, staff and families know how to respond in the event of an emergency.

# **Automated Messaging**

Our District uses SchoolMessenger, an automated messaging system, to quickly communicate with families via phone, text, and email. In the event of an emergency, such as a lockout or lockdown, calls will be made to all parent/guardian's home, work and cell phone numbers, along with emergency contacts 1-4 listed on the Student Profile Form updated every September (or when there is a change in contact information). The transcribed content of the messages will also be sent via email. Additionally, those who have downloaded the Brockport CSD mobile application will be notified via a push notification. If you do not have the mobile app and would like to download it, search for "Brockport Central" in your device's app store.

Our District may periodically use the automated messaging system to share other important information or lastminute event changes. Information classified as "non-emergency" will be primarily sent via email or text.

# **Website Alerts**

Additional information during emergency situations will also be posted on our District website and social media accounts when deemed appropriate. You may find the information on our website at bcs1.org or by searching @brockportcsd on Facebook or Twitter. Please remember to check these resources and refrain from calling you child's school in the event of an emergency so District personnel can focus their attention on the safety of students and communicating important information to families.

### **Lockouts and Lockdowns**

People often use the terms lockout and lockdown interchangeably. At BCSD, a lockout is initiated when there is a potential risk outside the building or District (i.e., an armed person is threatening the community; a suspicious condition, chemical spill or rabid/ aggressive animal exists in the area). During a lockout. exterior doors and windows are locked. outside activities are terminated and instruction continues as normal inside the buildina.

A lockdown is initiated when there is an impending risk to the building or District (i.e., an armed/violent/aggressive person threatening or attacking a school building or the District; an imminent threat that may involve a specific building or the District). In this case, the same protocols would be followed for a lockout, however, classroom doors are locked and instruction is halted.

# **How to Help During Emergency Situations**

- Listen carefully to automated phone calls and messages you receive. Please listen to the entire message, then visit our District website for more information at www.bcs1.org.
- · Don't panic. Just like you, we make your children's safety our main priority. We have procedures in place to keep everyone as safe as possible. We practice emergency drills multiple times each year with our students and staff and consistently review our safety procedures.
- · Avoid calling your child's school. We will notify you as more information becomes available.
- · Don't rush to campus. If there is an actual emergency on our campus where law enforcement or emergency personnel need to respond, it is critical to keep the campus clear so they can quickly resolve the situation.
- · Keep your contact information up-todate. It is important to have a current email address on file in addition to home, work and cell phone numbers.

# **2023 Capital Improvement Project**

Brockport Central School District's Board of Education voted to move forward with a \$28.270 million Capital Improvement Project that will be brought to voters on December 12, 2023. The District utilized its building condition survey (state required evaluation of school facilities by architects and engineers) to identify work that will be completed as part of the proposed Capital Project. The reconstruction work and improvements to be made will protect our investment in District buildings and campus facilities.

In addition to reconstruction and maintenance costs (roofing, window replacement, general construction, plumbing, HVAC, LED lighting and masonry), the proposed project will reduce energy usage and save utility costs. The District will utilize NYS building aid (est. 87%) and \$5.745 million from the 2021 Capital Reserve fund, allowing the District to complete the proposed \$28.270 million 2023 Capital Project with NO TAX IMPACT to local taxes. More information about the proposed Capital Project will be distributed to homes and posted on the District website in the near future. A public information meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 28 at 6 p.m. at Hill School.



# National School Bus Safety Week

Held during the third full week of October each year, the National School Bus Safety Week is an active public education program aimed at addressing school bus safety. This year's theme is 1 Bus + 1 Driver = a BIG Impact on Education.

Here are a few tips from the National Association for Pupil Transportation to keep our children safe:

# Walking to the Bus Stop

- · Walk young children to the bus stop
- Encourage children to walk in groups. There is safety in numbers, and groups are easier for drivers to see.
- Practice good pedestrian behavior: walk on the sidewalk, if there is no sidewalk stay out of the street. If you must walk in the street, walk single file, face traffic and stay close to the edge of the road.
- Stop and look left, right and then left again if you must cross the street or driveway.

# **Getting On and Off the Bus**

- Warn children that if they drop something getting on or off the bus, they should never pick it up. Instead, they should tell the driver and follow the driver's instructions.
- Remind children to look to the right before they step off the bus.
- If you meet your child at the bus stop after school, wait on the side where the child will be dropped off, not across the street. Children can be so excited to see you after school that they dash across the street and forget the safety rules.

Welcome to our Driver Education Program at Brockport High School. This is an exciting time for your child that comes with a great deal of freedom and responsibility! Our Driver Education Program is offered to anyone who desires expert instruction from highly qualified teachers prior to receiving a NYS Driver's License. Our Driver Education Program is a comprehensive experience that includes both theory and practice. This program is an investment in your child's future; providing them with the necessary knowledge and experience to become a safe driver.

Enrolled students will receive instruction in the classroom, behind the wheel, and on the road as required by New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Those successfully completing the class will receive an MV285 certificate that gives the holder the privilege to receive a Class D operator's license when reaching age 17, allowing them to drive after 9 p.m. Students must be 16 years old and hold a valid NYS Driver Permit or License to be eligible for the course. The Pre-Licensing 5-Hour Course material is included in Driver Education. The loan of a text is included in the class fee.

Most insurance companies will offer a discount on compulsory car insurance upon request.

Classroom instruction: ALL students must attend ALL classroom instruction in the Brockport High School Room 192

Please note: Student must be present for the first theory class to be allowed entry into the course. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of the first class. (Late arrivals will not be admitted and, if registered, will forfeit course enrollment). No early dismissals from theory class allowed.

# Students must have the following for theory class:

- Permit/license
- NYS Driver Manual
- · Notebook/folder
- · Writing materials

Students must be prepared with the following for each car class:

- · Permit/license
- Sunglasses are encouraged
- Appropriate footwear (i.e. no backless sandals)

**Driving groups:** will start and end at the High School eastside (poolside) parking lot. Driving classes may be rescheduled at the instructor's discretion due to inclement weather. Should a make-up driving class be requested by a student due to extenuating circumstances, the instructor will reschedule at their discretion. Driving groups may be rescheduled to place four drivers in each time block. Every effort will be made to accommodate rescheduling conflicts. However, the instructor reserves the right to create a schedule that is most effective in terms of number of students scheduled for each driving group. Scheduling of or transportation to the road test are not included. Parents or other qualified adults should plan to devote time for enrolled students to practice the skills learned in this class. Only experience and good judgment makes a safe driver. A current NYS Learner's Permit must be brought to all classes.

Registration directions: Please send your payment, completed registration form and a copy of the student's learner's permit to the address listed on the registration form.. The cost is \$470 for residents, \$490 for non-residents. The registration deadline for the Winter Session will end and January 17, 2024, for the Spring Session, March 27, 2024. Please select your drive groups, listing your choices in order of preference. First priority will be given to resident seniors, then resident juniors, then underclassmen and non-residents. Every effort will be made to accommodate your request. You will be notified by e-mail or telephone and a list will be posted in the High School if you have been accepted and enrolled. If a registrant did not get into the session, they will be notified in writing and placed on a priority list for the next session.


