## BHS CLASS OF 2022 Commencement

Brockport's Class of 2022 gathered in celebration for the 95th BHS Commencement ceremony held on June 26 at Frontier Field. Sounds of Pomp and Circumstance filled the stadium as the soon to be graduates, donned in blue caps and gowns, marched in to the cheering of family and friends.

Superintendent Sean Bruno warmly welcomed everyone and thanked Brockport's dedicated staff and supportive Board of Education members who assisted with this year's commencement journey. He also recognized the parents, family and friends whose support, faith and sacrifices brought everyone together to celebrate in the momentous occasion. The Superintendent reflected upon watching the Class of 2022 grow throughout the years and congratulated them on their many accomplishments. "All of you have the knowledge and skills needed to support your future and success. In your post graduate journey, you will find many situations that you can master. You will also face obstacles, both large and small," he said. "No matter the future path you choose, I challenge you that when you are faced with an obstacle, instead of seeing them as insurmountable, consider them as opportunities to do what is right. And Never, Never, Never give up!"

Both the Salutatorian Merin Squillante and 2022 Class President Kiera Wilson addressed their peers and highlighted the many memories and experiences they had throughout the years that bonded their class together. "Our

educational experience at Brockport helped to mold us into who we are today," said Squillante. "It opened our eyes to both the good and the bad of the world. Valedictorian Jasmyn Miller discussed the future of the Class of 2022 and the many choices that must be made. She explained that these experiences can serve as lessons to help build a life in which you are satisfied and proud of who you have become. "Your future is not set in stone yet," she said. "The world is always changing. The

boundaries of high school are quite rigid, but once you leave, it is up to you to take charge of your own life, and I wish you all the best."

This year's keynote speaker, BHS Social Studies teacher Christopher Beyrle, guoted Yoda saying, "fear leads to anger, anger leads to hate, and hate leads to suffering" unless there is hope. He told the graduating class that he has immense hope in each of them and in their generation. He asked them to take a moment and really think about what they cared about. Typically, people respond that they care about their family, friends and future. "No matter how different we may feel on other issues, we have that in common." Beyrle stated that throughout life, perspectives are often challenged and reevaluating beliefs can be scary. However, remembering what you care about can be helpful in discovering your truth.

Principal Michael Pincelli encouraged the class to take risks, always do their best and to be flexible. He summarized with baseball-inspired advice. "You won't win every game. The goal is to win more than you lose. If you can do that often enough, you may find that you have won it all."

Class of 2022, be proud of all you have accomplished, hold on to your memories, work hard, remember your roots and NEVER give up because you are our hope for a brighter future. Enjoy, the best is yet to come!

Below are just a few of the many awards and scholarships that were presented to our Brockport High School students this year. Brockport Central School District would like to thank the many sponsors for their continued support of our students and our District.

### Spirit of the People **Helping People Scholarship**

This award, in the amount of \$750, is sponsored by the Brockport Federal Credit Union and is presented to a graduating senior who has demonstrated academic achievement, has been accepted into college and has been highly involved in community service. ### Dr. Tobias Ekeze **Memorial Scholarship**

This award celebrates the memory of Dr. Ekeze, a beloved administrator, community member, coach, husband and father. Senior Jacob Miller won the 400-meter race to be officially crowned NYS Champion! His time of 47.79 set a new school record and is the fourth fastest time in


Section V history.
