



# BHS Students Compete in Envirothon

BHS students recently competed in the Monroe County and New York State Envirothon. Students were tested on their knowledge of forestry, aquatics, soils, wildlife and current issues. They also had to give an oral presentation to a panel of judges. Four teams of five students entered the Monroe County competition, and our BHS students took first, fourth, fifth and tenth out of eleven teams! The winning team, from Mrs. Cappella's AP Environmental Science course, went on to represent Brockport and Monroe County at the NYS Envirothon. They tied for sixth on their oral presentation, which discussed a plan to reduce compostable materials that go into landfills and addressed food insecurity concerns. They also placed eighth in aquatics, tenth in current environmental issues, seventeenth in soils, twentieth in forestry and twenty-third in wildlife management.

Happy summer!! Although summer vacation is a time to relax and rejuvenate, we hope your student will dedicate some time to reading.

Did you know that summer reading is essential to maintaining all students' schoolyear academic success? According to the book, No More Summer Reading Loss, "...the only summer activity related to improving reading achievement is summer reading."

Studies show that the effect of reading four or five books over the summer months can prevent a decline in reading from spring to fall. To help students maintain the success they worked so hard to achieve, we encourage you to include reading as one of your summer activities. The Suggested Summer Reading Lists can be found on the District's website (https://bcs1.org/news/what\_s\_new/summer\_reading) and can assist you in selecting books for your students.

#### Some tips to consider:

- Search for books that feature characters with different backgrounds, experiences and identities in order to learn about other people's lives and stories. This will teach children the importance of empathy and kindness.
- Choice is huge! Students respond better to reading when they have a choice in the reading material.
- Read aloud to your child. Children of ALL ages enjoy hearing and sharing a good story.
- Visit your public library. The public library has excellent resources and programs.

Remember, the best way to beat the summer slide is by reading!


### Students Recognized for Service to BHS Library

She gathered some friends, all avid readers, to work on this with her," explained Mrs. Jaccarino. "Elizabeth coined the venue, 'Jury's Verdict' and she (her friends joined later in the year) reviewed books, usually two/month, often more, centered on a theme. Elizabeth was steadfast and consistent in her efforts. Her reviews were insightful and thoughtful. She did this because of her love of reading and literature. It has been a pleasure working with her."



"Ella and Eilidh were instrumental in helping us with the shift of the library collection we recently undertook in the high school library," described Mrs. Jaccarino. "They saw us moving and shifting books, asked what we were doing and then asked if they could help! They spent weeks, of their own time, after school or during lunch, helping with this monumental task. Every book in the library was moved at least once, and often more. They were tireless and thoughtful about the work. They didn't do this for extrinsic reason, no rewards or credit, but rather just to help. I am not sure how long this task would have taken without their help, but we are grateful that they jumped right in to assist. As a result, the library collection looks more appealing, and the shelves are much more accessible."



### Hill Student Gives TEDx Talk

Ben George was a fourth-grade student in Mrs. Stoker and Mr. Albrecht's classroom at Hill School this past year. He is 9 years old, but he is already accomplishing amazing things.

At the end of April, Ben spoke about educational freedom on stage at the TEDx talk in Clinton, NY. Ben, who is one of the youngest TED talk speakers to ever take the stage, said he was both nervous and excited about the event. His talk addressed how educational freedom, the ability to help shape his own personal curriculum, has impacted him as a student and the beneficial impact it can have on other students. Ben has been able to take advantage of the opportunity of educational freedom this year, choosing different topics to focus on with reading assignments each night.



"Students should get to learn what they choose to be able to have more fun in school," said Ben. "One person would learn what they want to learn and the other would learn what they wanted to learn."

Ben was approached by Mr. Albrecht about the opportunity to present at the TEDx event after expressing an interest in taking ownership of his learning this year. "If I told myself a year ago that I'd be giving a speech to 150 people, I probably wouldn't have believed myself," said Ben.

### Students Learn Dangers of E-cigs/Vaping

Throughout the end of May, our Student Support Partners met with Hill School's fourth and fifth grade students to discuss the risks of e-cigarettes and vaping. The team talked about the hazards of use, what they look like and the addictive properties of nicotine. Congratulations to our students who participated in the BHS Career Internship Program. The group ended the year sharing what they learned through poster presentations.





Enrolled students will receive instruction in the classroom, behind the wheel and on the road, as required by New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Those successfully completing the class will receive an MV285 certificate that gives the holder the privilege to receive a Class D operator's license when reaching age 17, allowing them to drive after 9 p.m. Students must be 16 years old and hold a valid NYS Driver Permit or License to be eligible for the course. The Pre-Licensing 5-Hour Course material is included in Driver Education. The loan of a text is included in the class fee.

Most insurance companies will offer a discount on compulsory car insurance upon request.

Classroom instruction: ALL students must attend ALL classroom instruction in the Brockport High School Room 192 as scheduled from 3:15-4:45 p.m. Please note: Student must be present for the first theory class to be allowed entry into the course. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of the first class. (Late arrivals will not be admitted and, if registered, will forfeit course enrollment). No early dismissals from theory class allowed.

- NYS Driver Manual

### **Driver Education**

### Safe Driving Techniques (Five-Hour Course)

The NYS Bureau of Motor Vehicles requires five hours of classroom instruction as a prerequisite for obtaining a driver's license. Applicants affected by this regulation are those applying for a first-time driver's license; those applying for a driver's license because of a lapse of a one-year renewal grace period; and those applying for a new license as a result of revocation of a previous license. The five-hour training period must be completed prior to the applicant applying for a road test. Persons having completed a regular driving education course do NOT need this program.

The following regulations are applicable to all prospective registrants:

- Registration must be completed by mailing the registration form or in person at Oliver Middle School by noon the Tuesday immediately preceding the class. There is a seven-person minimum to hold this class. Registering on time reduces the risk of cancellation.
- Students will be admitted on a first-come, first-served basis.

- Applicants must be 16 years of age or older.
- Applicants must bring their valid learner's permit to register.
- Applicants must pay the \$40 registration fee upon registering and completely fill out the registration form.

An official completion certificate, which is valid for one year from the day of issuance, will be given upon completion of the five-hour program. This certificate must be presented when applying for a road test. It does not qualify participants for reduced insurance rates.
