BROCKPORT TRANSPORTATION

Hardworking, Dedicated, Caring,

These are just a few words to describe Brockport's amazing Transportation Team. Many drivers start their route before the sun, have additional runs throughout the day and often assist with special events in the evenings. They ensure our students arrive to school and return home safely each day. Everyone in the Department, from the office staff and mechanics to the drivers, take great pride in what they do and work hard to provide a positive and safe transportation experience for the District's students and families.

"The last few years, during the pandemic, have been the most challenging I've seen," said Interim Director of Transportation William Brawn. "Billy" retired from BCSD in January 2021 after almost 35 years in Transportation. He returned in December to assist when the existing director took another position.





Brawn explained how Brockport started the school year with 47 drivers managing 52 regular runs. To cover the daily routes, program runs and special events, many drivers regularly make multiple trips, pick-up different routes, switch buses and adjust schedules, as needed. This year, members of the team who typically remain in the office or garage, but have a CDL license and are eligible to drive, have often been found behind the wheel of a bus. Eligible retirees also help to fill the gaps. "We have learned a lot along the way to better manage (Brockport's transportation needs)," Brawn stated. "The District provided great tools, and we have understanding families." New drivers have been hired, and they are working through the training process. Although the Department continues to recruit, they believe those drivers in training will provide much-needed relief. Our Transportation Department provides stellar door-to-door service for our students. They are outstanding in what they do and have shown a tremendous amount of dedication and perseverance during these challenging times. As a community, we need to thank them for all they do.

The approved project will allow us to secure continued campus safety and increase the comfort of our learning environments, as well as protect our investment in District buildings and facilities while reducing energy usage and costs. Updates will be posted in future newsletters and on our website as they become available.

I look forward to the many events scheduled in the months ahead, including musicals, concerts, art shows and athletic competitions. INSTRUCTIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Universal Pre-kindergarten for 2022-23

Brockport will again offer a grant-funded universal pre-kindergarten (UPK) program. The program, with a strong focus on early learning, will start in September and follow the school calendar. Children will attend school five days a week for two and a half hours a day during morning or afternoon sessions. Since the grant requires a collaborative effort between BCSD and area childhood education agencies, some children will attend private schools, in addition to the majority of students who will attend Brockport's Ginther School.

To be eligible for the UPK program, children must be 4 years old by December 1, 2022, and a BCSD resident. Families are responsible for making their own transportation arrangements, as transportation is not part of the NYS Education Department grant.

If your child is not yet registered to receive UPK-related mailings and should be, please call the Registrar's Office at (585) 637-1857. Applications will be mailed in March to all eligible families.

Kindergarten Parent Info Night

Parents of children who will attend kindergarten this fall are invited to attend an information night on **Monday, March 7 from 6-7 p.m.** at the Ginther School. Career Internship Program

Brockport High School's Career Internship Program (CIP) started 20 years ago by a former BHS business teacher. Sue Sodoma, the District's Business and Career Education Department Chair, has served as the CIP Coordinator for the last eight years. Brockport seniors can gain experiences with a variety of internship opportunities, including: sports management, athletic training, dairy farming, communications, nursing, speech pathology, museum curator, social worker and veterinary technician, to name a few.

In a student's junior year, counselors will meet to discuss future goals and plans. The internship program is available as an option for students to learn more about what they might want to do in the future. Once accepted, juniors meet with Mrs. Sodoma to identify potential career interests. Together, they work to find an appropriate mentor. CIP students can do up to two internships to gain insight into

their career field of interest. In addition to the internship, students attend seminars to learn more about CIP, then what other careers are available and responsibilities as an employee. To earn high school credit, students must successfully complete 108 internship hours.

The internship program typically has 20 to 30 students. Several of the CIP students, who have completed the program, have been hired for their career choice or have gone on to college to pursue their degree. 

Driver Education

Welcome to our Driver Education Program at Brockport High School. This is an exciting time for your child that comes with a great deal of freedom and responsibility. Our Driver Education Program is offered to anyone who desires expert instruction from highly qualified teachers prior to receiving a NYS Driver's License. Our Driver Education Program is a comprehensive experience that includes both theory and practice. This program is an investment in your child's future; providing them with the necessary knowledge and experience to become a safe driver.

Enrolled students will receive instruction in the classroom, behind the wheel and on the road, as required by New York State Department of Motor Vehicles. Those successfully completing the class will receive an MV285 certificate that gives the holder the privilege to receive a Class D operator's license when reaching age 17, allowing them to drive after 9 p.m. Students must be 16 years old and hold a valid NYS Driver Permit or License to be eligible for the course. The Pre-Licensing Five-Hour Course material is included in Driver Education. The loan of a textbook is included in the class fee.

Most insurance companies will offer a discount on compulsory car insurance upon request.

Classroom instruction: ALL students must attend ALL classroom instruction in the Brockport High School Room 192.

Please note: Student must be present for the first theory class to be allowed entry into the course. Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start of the first class. (Late arrivals will not be admitted and, if registered, will forfeit course enrollment). No early dismissals from theory class are allowed.

Students must have the following for theory class:

- Permit/license
- NYS Driver Manual
- Notebook/folder
- Writing materials

Students must be prepared with the following for each car class:

- Permit/license
- Sunglasses are encouraged
- Appropriate footwear (i.e. no backless sandals)

Driving groups: will start and end at the east-side (pool) parking lot of the high school. Driving classes may be rescheduled at the instructor's discretion due to inclement weather. Should a make-up driving class be requested by a student due to extenuating circumstances, the instructor will reschedule at his discretion. Driving groups may be rescheduled to place four drivers in each time block. Every effort will be made to accommodate rescheduling conflicts. However, the instructor reserves the right to create a schedule that is most effective in terms of number of students scheduled for each driving group. Scheduling of, or transportation to, the road test are not included. Parents or other qualified adults should plan to devote time for enrolled students to practice the skills learned in this class. Only experience and good judgment will make a safe driver. A current NYS Learner's Permit must be brought to all classes.

Registration directions: send your payment, completed registration form and a copy of the student's learner's permit /license to the address listed below. The cost is \$470 for residents, \$490 for non-residents. The registration deadline for Session III will end March 18, 2022. Please select your drive groups, listing your choices in order of preference. First priority will be given to resident seniors, then resident juniors, then underclassmen and non-residents. Every effort will be made to accommodate your request. You will be notified by email or telephone, and a list will be posted in the high school if you have been accepted and enrolled. If a registrant did not get into the session, they will be notified in writing and placed on a priority list for the next session.

Driver Education

Safe Driving Techniques (Five-Hour Course)

The NYS Bureau of Motor Vehicles requires five hours of classroom instruction as a prerequisite for obtaining a driver's license. Applicants affected by this regulation are those applying for a first-time driver's license, those applying for a driver's license because of a lapse of a one-year renewal grace period, and those applying for a new license as a result of revocation of a previous license. The five-hour training period must be completed prior to the applicant applying for a road test. Persons having completed a regular driving education course do NOT need this program.

The following regulations are applicable to all prospective registrants:

 Registration must be completed by mailing the registration form or in person at Oliver Middle School by noon the Tuesday immediately preceding the class. There is a seven-person minimum to hold this class. Registering on time reduces the risk of cancellation.

- Students will be admitted on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Applicants must be 16 years of age or older.
- Applicants must bring their valid learner's permit to register.
- Applicants must pay the \$40 registration fee upon registering and completely fill out the registration form.

An official completion certificate, which is valid for one year from the day of issuance, will be given upon completion of the five-hour program. This certificate must be presented when applying for a road test. It does not qualify participants for reduced insurance rates.
