Board of Education Reorganization Meeting

BCSD held its annual reorganization meeting on July 6, 2021. During the meeting, newly re-elected board member, Daniel Legault, took the oath of office to serve a five-year term. The oath of office was administered to Terry Ann Carbone and Jeffrey Harradine, who were elected to serve as president and vice-president, respectively, and District Clerk Deb Moyer was also sworn in.

Regular board meetings are typically held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month at 6 p.m. They are typically held at the District Board Room in the Administration Building or at the Hill School Cafetorium. Meetings are open to the public. A complete BOE schedule can be found the District website under the District/Board of Education tabs.

Emergency Procedure Review

The safety and security of students and staff remains a priority at Brockport Central School District. Each year we review our emergency policies and procedures to ensure students, staff and families know how to respond in the event of an emergency.

Automated Messaging

The District uses SchoolMessenger, an automated messaging system, to guickly communicate with families via phone and email. In the event of an emergency, such as a lockout or lockdown, calls will be made to all parent/guardian's home, work and cell phone numbers, along with emergency contacts 1-4 listed on the Student Profile Form updated every September (or when there is a change in contact information). The text of the messages will also be sent via email. Additionally, those who have downloaded the Brockport CSD mobile application will be notified via a push notification. If you do not have the mobile app and would like to download it, search for "Brockport Central" in your device's app store.

The District will periodically use the automated messaging system to share other important information such as open house reminders or last-minute event changes. Information classified as "non-emergency" will be sent only to the primary phone numbers and email addresses on file.

Website Alerts

Additional information during emergency situations will also be posted on the District's website and social media accounts when deemed appropriate. You may find the information on our website at bcs1.org or by searching @brockportcsd on Facebook or Twitter. Please remember to check these resources and refrain from calling your child's school in the event of an emergency so district personnel can focus their attention on the safety of students.

Lockouts and Lockdowns

People often use the terms lockout and lockdown interchangeably. At BCSD, a lockout is initiated when there is a medical emergency or a potential risk outside the building or campus (i.e., an armed person is threatening the community; a suspicious condition, chemical spill or rabid/aggressive animal exists in the area). During a lockout, exterior doors and windows are locked, outside activities are terminated and instruction continues as normal inside the building.

A lockdown is initiated when there is an impending risk to the building or District (i.e., an armed/violent/aggressive person threatening or attacking a school building or the District; an imminent threat that may involve a specific building or the campus). In this case, the same protocols would be followed for a lockout, however, classroom doors are locked and instruction is halted.

How to Help During Emergency Situations

- Listen carefully to the automated phone calls and messages you receive. Please listen to the entire message, then visit the District's website for more information at www.bcs1.org.
- Don't panic. Just like you, we make your children's safety our main priority. We have solid procedures in place to keep them safe. We practice emergency drills multiple times each year with our students and staff and consistently review our safety procedures.
- Avoid calling your child's school. We will notify you as more information becomes available.
- Don't rush to campus. If there is an actual emergency on our campus where law enforcement or emergency personnel need to respond, it is critical to keep the campus clear so they can quickly resolve the situation.
- Keep your contact information up-todate. It is important to have a current email address on file in addition to home, work and cell phone numbers.

Ginther students participated in a virtual PBIS Kick-Off Assembly this fall. Hill's Safety Patrol

Hill School's Safety Patrol is comprised of respectful, responsible fourth and fifth-grade students who aim to help make good decisions. Members are assigned posts at dismissal to remind students about safe transitions from school to home. Students must apply to their classroom teacher. One patroller and an alternate are selected based on strong character and high work ethic. Meetings take place monthly, and safety patrollers can be easily seen throughout the halls at Hill wearing their bright yellow belts. Thank you, Safety Patrol, for helping to keep Hill safe!

OMS Remembers 9/11

Mr. Kiesow's seventh-grade social studies class learned about September 11 and the reason why so many commemorated the day during the twentieth anniversary. Students discussed what they knew about the day prior to the lesson, then spent time watching a video about the terrorist attacks. They listened to former President Bush's speech and read newspaper articles from the day after. Students posted questions anonymously that were addressed when the class reconvened for group discussion. The lesson was emotional, as students tried to grasp how an event such as 9/11 could happen.





BHS: Focus. Learn. Engage. Connect

13WHAM News joined students during freshman orientation at BHS to feature Brockport in a back-to-school segment in the station's morning newscast. The segment focused on the popular F.L.E.C. - Focus. Learn. Engage. Connect – program at the school, which gives incoming freshmen a chance to explore the high school and connect with upperclassmen. Our FLEC students connected virtually with the ninth-graders last year, so it was nice to see everyone in person again this fall. Upperclassmen will continue to interact with the freshman class throughout the year, teaching lessons on a weekly basis.

National School Bus Safety Week

Held during the third full week of October each year, the National School Bus Safety Week is an active public education program aimed at addressing school bus safety. This year's theme is **Be Safe - Know the Danger Zone.**

Here are a few tips from the National Association for Pupil Transportation to keep our children safe:

Walking to the Bus Stop

- Walk young children to the bus stop.
- Encourage children to walk in groups. There is safety in numbers, and groups are easier for drivers to see.
- Practice good pedestrian behavior: walk on the sidewalk, if there is no sidewalk, stay out of the street. If you must walk in the street, walk single file, face traffic and stay close to the edge of the road.
- Stop and look left, right and then left again if you must cross the street or driveway.

Getting On and Off the Bus

- Warn children that if they drop something getting on or off the bus, they should never pick it up. Instead, they should tell the driver and follow the driver's instructions.
- Remind children to look to the right before they step off the bus.
- If you meet your child at the bus stop after school, wait on the side where the child will be dropped off, not across the street. Children can be so excited to see you after school that they dash across the street and forget the safety rules.

Red Ribbon Week

The Red Ribbon Campaign is the oldest and largest drug prevention campaign in the country and is a great way to kick off conversations about drug prevention.



This year's theme was **Drug Free Looks Like Me.** The theme is a

reminder that everyday Americans across the country make significant daily contributions to their communities by being the best they can be because they live a drug-free life. Oliver Middle School and Brockport High School hosted a variety of activities throughout the end of October to raise awareness and take a stand against drugs. Students dressed up for themed days, posters were created and pledges were signed to remain drug free.

2021 Capital Improvement Project

Brockport Central School District's Board of Education voted to move forward with a \$11.335 million Capital Improvement Project that will be brought to voters on December 14, 2021.

The District utilized its building condition survey (state required evaluation of school facilities by architects and engineers) to identify work that will be completed as part of the proposed Capital Project. The reconstruction work and improvements to be made will protect our investment in District buildings and campus facilities. In addition to reconstruction and maintenance costs (roofing, electrical, general construction, plumbing and HVAC), the proposed project will reduce energy usage and save utility costs.

The District will utilize NYS building aid (est. 87.8%) and \$2.3 million from the 2014 Capital Reserve fund, allowing the District to complete the proposed \$11.335 million 2021 Capital Project with **no impact to local taxes**. More information about the proposed Capital Project will be distributed to homes and posted on the District website in the near future.

ATHLETIC HIGHLIGHTS

Brockport's fall athletic season has successfully ended. It was great to see our teams competing in a more traditional way this year. We would like to thank our athletes, coaches, families and spectators for doing their part to keep everyone safe while cheering on our Blue Devils.

Our Girls Varsity Tennis finished undefeated in their division, securing the Monroe County Division 2 Championship. Our boys and girls Varsity Soccer Teams will be hosting sectional games. Way to go Brockport!

We look forward to a fairly typical winter season, which will include Unified Bowling, Wrestling, Boys and Girls Basketball, Indoor Track, Boys Swimming and Hockey. For the first time ever, the Varsity Hockey team will be combined with Spencerport Central School District. Registration for all winter sports opened on October 15. Tryouts for junior varsity and varsity are scheduled to start on November 15, with modified beginning the Monday after Thanksgiving break.



Fun Run and Middle School Mile

Congratulations to all of our students, grades 2-6, who participated in this year's Fun Run and Middle School Mile. The high school's cross country team and girl's modified B soccer teams led runners in warm-ups before each event and served as the lead runner to guide students throughout the course. Students in sixth grade ran a full mile,



and students in grades 2-5 completed a half-mile course. Races started and ended at the high school stadium. Each group was cheered on enthusiastically by the spectators. Thank you to the student participants, volunteers, physical education teachers, PTSA, staff and families for making this event such a success!

Brockport Central School District is implementing the following procedures for all athletic events:

- No backpacks, bookbags or duffle bags
- No outside food, drinks or containers
- Middle school students, or younger, must have parental supervision for the entire event
- No pets
- No bicycles, skateboards or scooters

Additionally, spectators must always demonstrate self-control and respect for others, and there should be no profanity or degrading language/ gestures. All persons must adhere to the District's

Code of Conduct, which can be found on the District's website under Students/Code of Conduct.

Our students continue to be our first priority. In Brockport, we value integrity, diversity and respect for all. 
